In 2022, Mobile, AL had a population of 186k people with a median age of 37.6 and a median household income of \$48,524. Between 2021 and 2022 the population of Mobile, AL declined from 187,445 to 186,316, a -0.602% decrease and its median household income grew from \$44,780 to \$48,524, a 8.36% increase.

The 5 largest ethnic groups in Mobile, AL are Black or African American (Non-Hispanic) (52.9%), White (Non-Hispanic) (39.7%), Two+ (Non-Hispanic) (2.18%), Asian (Non-Hispanic) (1.85%), and Two+ (Hispanic) (1.25%).

None of the households in Mobile, AL reported speaking a non-English language at home as their primary shared language. This does not consider the potential multi-lingual nature of households, but only the primary self-reported

language spoken by all members of the household.

98.3% of the residents in Mobile, AL are U.S. citizens.

The largest universities in Mobile, AL are [University of South Alabama](#) (3,705 degrees awarded in 2022), [Bishop State Community College](#) (651 degrees), and [Spring Hill College](#) (305 degrees).

In 2022, the median property value in Mobile, AL was \$158,400, and the homeownership rate was 50.6%.

Most people in Mobile, AL drove alone to work, and the average commute time was 22.8 minutes. The average car ownership in Mobile, AL was 2 cars per household.

The largest demographic living in poverty are Females 25 - 34, followed by Females 18 - 24 and then Females 55 - 64.

The most common racial or ethnic group living below the poverty line in Mobile, AL is Black, followed by White and Two Or More.

The Census Bureau uses a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who classifies as impoverished. If a family's total income is less than the family's threshold than that family and every individual in it is considered to be living in poverty.

89% of the population of Mobile, AL has health coverage, with 41.8% on employee plans, 20.9% on Medicaid, 12.4% on Medicare, 12.3% on non-group plans, and 1.69% on military or VA plans.

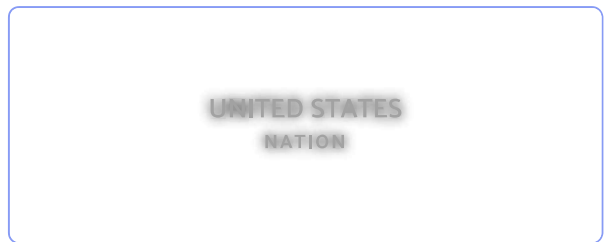
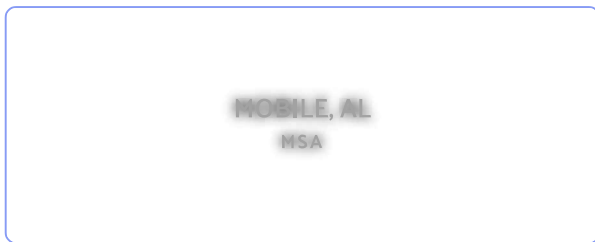
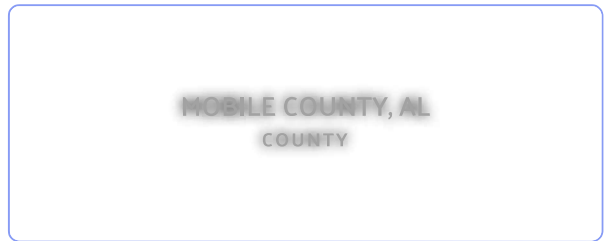
